Shelter Cove, CA -- Inn of The Lost Coast. If you are looking for an out of the way peaceful place to visit, Shelter Cove is a must see. This small portion of Northern California's cost was one of the last places to be mapped in California. Its unique topography made it dif-

ficult to access. It is a small portion of coast-line that is surrounded by 4000 foot mountains. It was a fishing port due to easier access by boat. A single paved road in and out is it's only access by car. There is also a small airstrip. If you happen to have a four-



wheel drive vehicle, there are beautiful unpaved forest roads to gain entry from the north and south. The southern road is more difficult, especially in early spring. I had to pull a few downed trees out of my way. But the drive and the views were worth it. The Inn of the Lost Coast is a peaceful, dog friendly inn perched upon a high cliff overlooking the Pacific Ocean. If the temperature is nice, you can sleep with the windows open and hear the mesmerizing sounds of crashing waves lulling you to sleep.


Travel & Get away

There is a nearby beach called Black Sand Beach, that has an incredible view and fine black sand from erosion of the local rocks that parallels some of the toe-tickling fine sands of Fire Island, NY. Napa and Sonoma Valleys are east of highway 101 on your drive up. It is a significant detour, but if you have the time, its worth it. Even closer, just north of Napa and Sonoma, is Alexander Valley. 


